In November, many members of our Council attended the Remembrance Day services in Bardney, Southrey and Stainfield. It was lovely to see such great attendances. After a service in St Lawrence Church, the Bardney ceremony concluded with a formal unveiling of the Memorial Benches by the Reverend Harry Jeffery. The IX(B) Squadron Association also paid tribute to the lives of comrades lost by laying wreaths at the base of the propeller memorial .

After attending a number of planning meetings in October, BGPC collaborated with Bardney Christian Community Trust, Bardney's Churches, Bardney Gateway Centre and Vicky Pearson to create two warm spaces to help with rising energy costs, which will continue until Spring 2023.

The Council had no meeting in December and concluded the year by having a small get-together in the Parish Office on the 20th December for Councillors and members of the public. This was enjoyed by all who attended. The New Year was soon upon us and the months are already flying by.

Queen's Memorial Tree Planting Ceremony

On the 14th February, the Lord-Lieutenant for Lincolnshire ceremoniously dedicated the planting of a very special tree in Bardney, in honour of her late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

This was a single tree from the giant sculpture of trees installed outside Buckingham Palace as part of the Platinum Jubilee celebrations. The sculpture consisted of 80 steel branches holding 350 trees in aluminium pots bearing the Queen's cypher.

One of these trees was awarded to Bardney Group Parish Council in recognition of our efforts and contributions to the local community and to inspire the next generation of tree planters.

Thanks to all those who turned out to mark the occasion, despite the cold and murky weather!

WHAT DO LOCAL COUNCILS DO?

Your local (parish and town) council has overall responsibility for the wellbeing of your local community. Their work falls into three main categories:

- Delivery of services
- Improve quality of life for residents
- Give communities a democratic voice

Local councils run numerous services, depending on the size of the council. Many you will see day-to-day, but some are less known. These include introducing solar panels, setting up dementia-friendly groups, organising community buses, creating neighbourhood plans, implementing suitable housing, establishing youth projects, managing allotments and open spaces, maintaining footpaths, public seating and litter bins.

BECOMING A LOCAL COUNCILLOR

As a local councillor you can become a voice for your community and make real change. Local councillors are the champions of their community who invest time in local projects and issues to the benefit of residents and the neighbourhood.

Local councillor responsibilities fall into three main categories:

- Decision-making
- Monitoring
- Getting involved locally

Local councillors attend to local needs of residents, local groups and businesses, make decisions on local services, collaborate with district and borough councils to adhere to local needs, and progress vital projects to invest in the future of the community.

CAN I STAND FOR ELECTION?

To stand for election to a local council you must be:

- A UK or Commonwealth citizen; or be a citizen of the Republic of Ireland; or be a citizen of another Member State of the European Union
- At least 18 years old
- An elector of the local council; or in the past 12 months occupied land or other premises in the area the local council serves (as owner or tenant); or work in the area local council serves (as your principal or only place of work); or live within three miles of the local council boundary
