# February 2022

- We welcomed the Lord Lieutenant for Lincolnshire to our Parishes to ceremoniously plant trees for the Queen's Green Canopy initiative
- Attended the first community meeting for Platinum Jubilee Event Planning at the Open Door in Bardney, and agreed a provisional timetable of events

# **Tree Planting Ceremony**



On the 25th of February, Bardney Group Parish Council welcomed The Queen's Representative, the Lord Lieutenant for Lincolnshire, Mr Toby Dennis. The purpose of his visit, was to plant two of the three trees which will form part of the Queen's Green Canopy initiative in our area.

The planting in Bardney was witnessed by children from Bardney Primary School as well as representatives of various organisations and religious groups. The Lord Lieutenant then moved on to Stainfield to plant the Queen's tree in the car park of Stainfield and Apley Village Hall.

This formed part of a series of events which will take place over the coming year and involve all the communities and villages.

# **Community Payback Team**

The Council has wanted to address the undulations in the ground in the cemetery for a while, however lockdown and other factors delayed the work being carried out. Thanks to the help and hard work from the Community Payback team the works have now been completed.

# New RAF Bench Installed at Bardney



In April, the new RAF bench arrived in Bardney.

The new bench, situated next to the Village Green, has been jointly funded by IX(B) Squadron Association and BGPC and is in recognition of the long standing friendship between the two communities.

There will be a formal opening of the bench at the end of May.

The bench is also next to two of the ten new planters which have been placed around Apley, Bardney, Southrey and Stainfield, which commemorate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee.

Sadly, the bench has already been a target of vandalism, whilst we are very disappointed this has happened, will try to ensure this does not detract from it's significance and value to the community.

# Lindum Group Endurance Event






# 2021/2022 Finances

Our Finances for the previous accounting period have shown some fluctuations due to expenditure on purchasing and setting up the new Parish Office, however despite this we were still able to finish the year within budget.

Unfortunately, the expenses from the relocation and purchasing of the new Parish Office in September were unavoidable due expiry of the lease and LCC wishing to reclaim our old office at the Fire Station.

However, we remain certain that now established the costs will decrease and it will be more effective for us to manage the cemetery and allotments, as well as communicating with members of the public from a more accessible location.

In other areas of our finances, it should be recognised that the costs for salaries are lower than stated in regards to our Handyman, as income is received from Wragby Parish Council for sharing his services.


